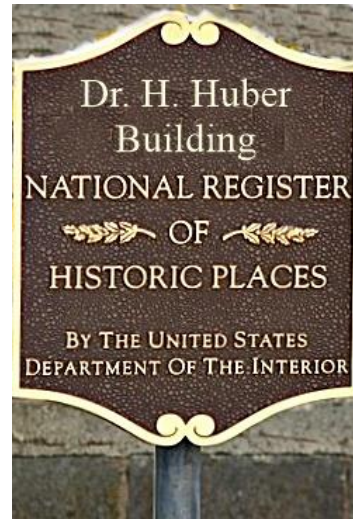


Dr. Huber Building

Building was erected in 1882

102, 106 West Main St. North Side Dr. H. Huber Block, was a historic commercial building in downtown Ottawa. It was erected for him by the Sutton & Laskey Company. Dr. Hubert Huber, was a native of Villingen-Schwenningen a town in the Schwarzwald-Baar district in southern Baden-Württemberg, Germany, and a graduate of Heidelberg & Berne Universities. He immigrated to Glandorf in 1853. He moved to Ottawa in 1882.

2019 - Green Zone (no building)
